## 2022 Session—Week 8 List of Scheduled "Executive Session" Action (Committee Votes) —

**NOTE:** There will only be a few more public hearings for 2022 Session and none of those on Monday are of interest/import to us. Nearly all actions on Monday, the final "opposite chamber" fiscal cutoff day, involve scheduled Committee votes.

## Monday, February 28, 2022

Senate Ways & Means – 10 AM – Bills up for Executive Session action (Committee votes) include: ESHB 1866, assisting those receiving community support services through medical assistance to receive supportive housing; SHB 1620, grant program for local agencies to offset costs of extreme-weather events; E2SHB 1117, integrating salmon recovery into GMA planning; HB 1700, sustainable funding for the Derelict Vessel Removal Program; SHB 1967, property tax exemptions for church properties hosting Farmers Markets; EHSB 1643, Real Estate Excise Tax exemptions for affordable housing transactions; HB 2058, leasehold excise tax exemptions for State Parks facilities on national or state historic register; ESHB 1841, property tax incentive for Accessory Dwelling Units housing those at 60 AMI or below; 2SHB 2078, outdoor school and outdoor experience learning for all; 2SHB 1827, community reinvestment programs; 2SHB 1905, reducing homelessness for youth and young adults discharging from a publicly funded system of care; and E2SHB 1099, integrating climate change into GMA comprehensive planning.

**House Transportation – 10 AM –** Bills up for Executive Session action (Committee votes) include: **2SSB 5332,** concerning off-road and all-terrain vehicles; and **SB 5687,** concerning traffic safety improvements.

**House Appropriations** – **11 AM** – Bills up for Executive Session action (Committee votes) include: **HB 2018**, creating a three-day sales tax holiday over Labor Day Weekend; **2SSB 5649**, regarding the Paid Family & Medical Leave program; and **E2SSB 5796**, restructuring marijuana revenues.

**Senate Transportation – 1 PM –** Bills up for Executive Session action (Committee votes) include **HB 2074**, concerning fees for out-of-state residents who register their off-road vehicles in Washington.
