Washington Recreation & Park Association End of Week 2 Report – Sunday January 26, 2025

Week two of the 2025 legislative session continued with lawmakers introducing bills, committees holding work sessions on important topics, and committees scheduling bills for public hearings. Lawmakers continued to review proposals on various issues including transportation, housing, education, healthcare, public safety, and more. Conversations continued around transportation funding, relating to state highway maintenance, and expanding public transit. Legislators introduced affordable housing proposals that are aimed at easing zoning restrictions and funding affordable housing projects. Also, several education related bills were introduced that are focused on improving school safety, teacher salaries, and supporting student mental health. These discussions and more will set the stage for priorities that will be advanced over the next several weeks, with committees already scheduling bills for executive action, where bills pass out of committee and are moved along in the process for further debate. In an uncommon move, week two concluded with floor action in the House, where the permanent rules of the House of Representatives were amended. Changes included who from the Governor's office can enter the wings of the House chamber, and adjusting the threshold for when debate can be ended.
