Washington Recreation & Park Association End of Week 6 Report – Sunday, February 23, 2025

Sunday, February 23 marks day 42 of the 2025 Legislative Session and with that, we have cleared the first official cutoff of the session. Friday (Feb. 21) was the last day that policy bills could be considered in their original policy committee, and if those bills did not move out of those committees by now, they are considered dead for this session. For the upcoming week, focus will turn to the budget committees, where budget chairs will spend the week hearing bills with fiscal implications passed to their committees for further consideration. These bills continue to be amended and revised as they move through the committee process, which requires ongoing monitoring and review. The next cutoff comes quickly, as Friday February 28th is the fiscal committee cutoff where bills will need to be heard and passed out of their respective budget committees to continue to be considered by the legislature this year (bills deemed necessary to implement the budget have certain exemptions).

This upcoming week, Governor Ferguson's team is also expected to publish budget cuts from state agencies that were directed to cut 6% (some agencies 3%) from their agency budgets. This effort comes from the Governor's direction, as the state grapples with a projected \$12 - \$16 billion deficit over the next four years. In addition to cuts, the legislature is also considering various revenue proposals to fill budget gaps, and those conversations are expected to heat up in the coming weeks. The state's next revenue forecast is scheduled for March 20, and we'll see initial budget proposals from the legislature soon after.
