## End of Week 4 Report – Sunday, February 8, 2026

Sunday, February 8<sup>th</sup> marks day 28 of the 2026 session and with that, we have cleared the first official cutoff of session. Wednesday, February 4<sup>th</sup> was the last day that policy bills could be considered in their original policy committee, and if those bills did not pass out of those committees by now, they are considered dead for this session. After Wednesday, the focus turned to the budget committees, where budget chairs have been spending long days hearing bills with fiscal implications passed to their committees for further consideration. These bills continue to be amended and revised as they move through the committee process, which requires ongoing monitoring and review. The next cutoff comes quickly, as Monday February 9<sup>th</sup> is the fiscal committee cutoff where bills will need to be heard and passed out of their respective budget committees to continue to be considered by the legislature this year (bills impacting the budget have certain exemptions). After Monday, the legislature will spend their time on the floor, voting on bills to pass them over to the opposite chamber.

Also this past week, the highly anticipated “[millionaires’ tax](#)” legislation was introduced as [Senate Bill 6346](#) and [House Bill 2724](#) (companion bills). As written, the bill would impose a new 9.9% tax on individuals’ income exceeding \$1 million beginning in calendar year 2028. The bill also expands the Working Families Tax Credit, doubles the B&O tax credit for small businesses, increases the B&O tax return filing threshold to \$250k, provides sales and use tax exemptions for grooming and hygiene products, and exempts the individual income tax from a statutory prohibition on state and local income taxes. The bill had a public hearing in the Senate Ways & Means committee on Friday, February 6<sup>th</sup>, and thousands of individuals signed in on the bill. The bill has been scheduled for executive action in the Ways & Means committee on Monday, February 9<sup>th</sup>.
