Washington Recreation & Park Association Bill Status & Upcoming Events Report End of Week 4 Report – February 3, 2024

Saturday, February 3rd marked day 27 of the 2024 regular session and with that, we have cleared the first official cutoff of session. Wednesday, January 31st was the last day that policy bills could be considered in their original policy committee, and if those bills did not pass out of those committees by now, they are considered dead for this session. Since Wednesday, the focus has turned to the budget committees, where budget chairs have been spending long days hearing bills with fiscal implications passed to their committees for further consideration. These bills continue to be amended and revised as they move through the committee process, which requires ongoing monitoring and review. The next cutoff comes quickly, as Monday February 5th is the fiscal committees to continue to be considered by the legislature this year (bills impacting the budget have certain exemptions).
